Background and Introduction

Bandarban is the most underdeveloped area of CHT, Education and poorer socio-economic status than the other two hill districts Rangamati and Khagrachari. The region is a food deficit area. Majority households in the upazila faced food crisis and a good number of them are experiencing chronic food deficits. Many communities in the CHT, especially those depending on Jhum cultivation for their livelihood, experience moderate to severe food insecurity.

The Chittagong Hill Tracts has been a conflict ridden region of Bangladesh for about more than two decades and until recently was largely left out of the various development efforts that had been undertaken in the rest of the country. However, in the wake of the CHT Peace Accord of 1998, many development organizations have begun operations in the region.

Ethnically diverse populations, 11 different ethnic groups of people speak 11 different languages, language barrier, to certain degree; become a barrier to the development education and extension works.

Eleven different indigenous communities and the Bengali community inhabit the greater Chittagong Hill Tracts (Rangamati, Bandarban and Khagrachari districts). It covers an area of 5093 square miles, mostly hilly and inaccessible. The very different geography, culture and social practice of this region compared with the rest of the country has clearly side lined it in terms of national development. In addition to that, political trouble over the last few decades has destroyed any existing small local initiatives and drives for realizing positive social change. Until recently therefore this region has had no exposure to any development activities and the majority of the CHT population continues to be very underprivileged and poor.

Inspiration of staff of AKS leads to increase in organizational accomplishments. An environment of collective participation and sharing stimulate and energize the working human resources to move forward with newer speed.

Program Title: **Sustainable Rising through Empowerment and youth Advancement**

Goal: Improved social security of young women in Bandarban Hill District.

Outcomes:

1. Increased leadership skill of young women (age 12 to 25) for raising their voice in every social issue in Bandarban district.
2. Increased capacity of young women for self-protection.
3. Improved access to services (health, safety net, education etc.) of young women.
4. Increased of local ethnic women's networks to advocacy on inheritance right of ethnic women in CHT.

Monthly group Meeting or study circle for adolescent groups

Girls Group monthly meeting have conducted every month with Adolescent girls group members. The discussion topics were Women empowerment, Human rights, early/child marriage, gender, Violence against women & child, Leadership, transformative leadership from the module book.

Purpose of monthly group meeting is to aware girls on discussed topic. So that they can raise their voice on any issue with them or nearby to them and take necessary steps against the issue with the help of guardian.



Annual conference/workshop with group leaders & members

Annual conference/workshop with group leaders & members of SREYA program. Additional SP was presented as chief guest, UHCFO, Journalist presented as special

guest, also presented Executive members of AKS, Master trainer of BNPS, SREYA girls group members, SREYA staffs and the events was chaired by Executive Director, AKS. Adolescent girls share their experience, perform role play from their experience, perform culture program such as different traditional dances, song.

The outcome of the program was girls are experiencing getting to know each other and many of them express that they are strong because they united or together and also having fun with their friends. Learning, sharing and cultural exchange among girls club member is the purpose of the event. AKS try to keep equality on religion, caste & tribe. Create a platform to express their learning.



Organized theatre show on VAW

Theater show has been organized on VAW (Violence Against Women) in Community level.

The purpose of the theatre show is to make aware to the community people about Early/Child marriage, violence against girls and women.

The outcome of the event was through these show adolescent girls and their parents were aware on any violence issues in the community.



Organize movement events

SREYA project had organized Movement events on Marriage registration and violence against Women & child at village level. On the event participations were adolescent girls, local leaders, social activist, civil society people.

The purpose of the event was to aware adolescent girls and parents on violence of women and early marriage, aware adolescent girls and parents on women rights, marriage registration on ethnic community.

Local leaders & Civil society people ensure about supporting on violence issues.



Round table dialogue with District administration/regional Council /law-enforcing agencies to ensure social safety-net for girls.

Anaya Kallyan Sangathon, SREYA program had organized Round table dialogue with District administration and non-government line department to ensure social safety-net

for girls. The purpose of the event was 'Ensure social safety-net for girls' in Bandarban district.

Government and non-government line department of Bandarban district had Participated and workshop program has chaired by Program Director, Additional SP, Sadar circle was present as chief guest, District Livestock Officer was present as special guest. The event was done by the participatory of different Government and non-government line department such as youth development, livestock department, OCC, BRAC, journalist etc. Adolescent girls club members and SREYA staffs. The purpose of the discussion was mainly strong linkage with Police department for easy access for help for any incidents or problems they face.

The discussion was done openly from the bottom of their hearts and line department & govt. organizations assured to help and give support on social safety to adolescent girls. Adolescent girls had shared their experience and expectation from the workshop. The workshop was done very cheerfully and successfully.



Dialogue with different government office and public service department (we are going to do this event with line department who can provide support such as health, education, social service, youth development etc. in Upazila base)

SREYA program, AnanyaKallyanSangathon organized had organized event Dialogue with different government office and public service department for getting supports (e.g. health, education, legal support, information, livelihood, safety net programs and other basic necessities) for girls. The event was done successfully with 43 invited guest & participants from different line department such as TotthoApa, Youth Development, Social service office, Upazila Secondary Education Department, OCC, Ward Counselors, Activist forum members, Journalist, SREYA program adolescent girls group and SREYA program staffs. The workshop was done very cheerfully and successfully.

Day Observation

Strengthening the adolescent during the report periods SREYA program, AKS have observed National girl's child day, International Women's Day and World Menstrual Hygiene Day.

International Youth Day held at Kalaghatajele Para. The Theme is **"Intergenerational Solidarity: Creating a World for All Ages"**.

On the event ward councilor was present as chief, Dudok chairman and Activist forum's members were attended as special guest, Executive Director of AKS present as event chairperson SREYA program's all staffs and adolescent's girls and parents were participated the event.

Arrange Speech competition on a specific topics and outdoor games for girls. All guests had spoken on International Youth Day. Then from adolescent club Joyerprotoi group Nasrin Akter speaks about her feelings after joining SREYA program's adolescent club and adolescent girls perform dance. For speech and outdoor game we chose 1st, 2nd and 3rd and gift was given by the Guests to the winners.

Ananya Kallyan Sangathon (AKS), SREYA Program had celebrated **National Girl Child Day** at Mro Abashik High School. Event was attended by Mr. Ukyaw nu Marma- Chairman, Sualok union as chief guest, Miss. Dawnai Prue Naly- Executive Director of AKS, Miss. Niloka Tangchangya- Executive Committee member of AKS as special guest, event was chaired by Mr. Mohin Uddin- Head teacher of Mro Abashik High School, also attended Mr. Dinendra Tripura- Program Director of AKS and all teachers of Mro Abashik High School. SREYA program staffs and boys & girls from Mro Abashik Hostel were participated the event.

The Theme is **“Pledge of Time, Rights of the Girl Child”**.

Adolescent girl's football tournament has started between Plung and Tumpao group. Plung group won the match through penalty.

After football match our guests shared their thoughts and 2 girls from Adolescent girls group shared their experience. In the midst our adolescent girls performed dance. Then trophy was given to both team as 1st and 2nd. At last Mr. Mohin Uddin- Head teacher of Mro Abashik High School closed the event.

International Women's Day held at Langi Para Primary School hall room by SREYA program, Ananya Kallyan Sangathon (AKS).

The Theme is **“Digital: Innovation and technology for gender equality”**.

At the beginning recites the concept note on International Women's Day and purpose of the day by Kulsuma Akter-CF, SREYA program. After that Lalliankim Diana-PC, SREYA program welcomed all guests and participants.

Then at 1st part girls had speech competition on session topics, culture program

On part 2 arranged outdoor games for girls & guardian. Karbari from Langipara & a guardian had speech then gift distribution among the winners and at last Primary school head teacher close the program.

World Menstrual Hygiene Day held at Donbosco hostel hall room by SREYA program, Ananya Kallyan Sangathon (AKS).

The Theme is **“Making menstruation a normal fact of life by 2030”**.

On event Hostel guest were Donbosco church assistance priest, sisters, Program Director of AKS, Medical officer- Upazila health complex was attended as a special guest, SREYA program staffs, Donbosco hostel girls were present as a participants and the program was chaired by Executive Director of AKS **DawnaiPrueNaly**.

Dr. Md. Tarequul Islam- Medical Officer, UH&FPO office sadar gave message on menstrual and how to maintain hygiene during menstrual. All guest gave speech on the importance of menstrual hygiene and Isihta Tripura- President of Siaolai group shared their thought and experience. Then sanitary pad was distributed among the group girls and following to that Sialolai, Arong, Kaskang groups' girls perform dance & sing song. At last Miss DawnaiPrueNaly- Executive Director of AKS gave valuable message to girls and closes the event.

The event was successfully done as the participants girls were attended the whole event joyfully and cheerfully. Most importantly they were open about their problem what they face during menstruation.





AKS OLHF Annual Report July-2022 to June-2023:

About the Programme Our Lives, Our Health, Our Futures (OLHF):

Our Lives, Our Health, Our Futures (funded by the European Union) aims to enable and support young women and adolescent girls from indigenous groups to transition into adult womanhood with dignity, and bodily and sexual autonomy, without violence, coercion and/or discrimination.

This programme is designed to holistically support the empowerment of young women and adolescent girls while also targeting key gatekeepers and service providers to foster an enabling environment.

The year July-2022 to June-2023 was a remarkable for the AKS OLHF Project. The project has continued carrying out project operations to achieve its objectives in accordance with the laws and directives of the government during the year. This resulted in a number of significant tasks the project accomplished in this reporting years.

Aim of the project:

To empower and enable adolescent girls and young women (aged 10-25 years) of the hill areas to live non-discrimination, dignified and violence-free lives while maintaining their physical and sexual independence from adolescence to womanhood.

Objective of the project:

1. Capacity building of civil society organizations at the local level on technical, procedural, financial management and thematic issues (SRHR, Gender Based Violence and Menstrual Health Management) will create a social system that prioritizes the sexual and reproductive health needs of women and adolescent girls where no form of violence against women exists. And there will be no discrimination;
2. To empower backward women and girls of Chittagong Hill Tracts to make informed decisions about SRHR, Gender Based Violence and Menstrual Health Management so that they can lead discrimination-free, independent and dignified lives.

Numbers of Beneficiaries at the project:

- Total girls and young women : 1200 girls
- Total women (mothers) : 1200 mothers
- Total male members (father and brother) : 2400 fathers and brothers
- Girls Club : 30 (at 30 villages)
- Mentors : 30 women

Monthly Girls' Club sessions:

Monthly Girls' Club sessions:

One of the significant achievement in July-2022 to June-2023 is conducting 1320 girls club sessions about sexual reproductive organs, menstruations and menstrual health, puberty, etc., and teaching 1200 girls how to make reusable sanitary pads and creative project at the girls clubs. Importantly, 30 mentors received training on puberty, menstrual health, sex, sexuality, and concerns of abuse against girls and young women before the girl's club session.



Among all the sessions done in July-2022 to June-2023, reusable sanitary pads making and creative projects by girls' club members is a remarkable achievement for OLHF project. The girls club members showed interest in this sessions and expressed their opinion that they enjoyed so much as now they have learnt how to make reusable sanitary pads and learnt different creative projects such as drama, art, wall-magazine, dance, song, handicraft, weaving and swing at their respective girls' club Later on in the early 2023 the girls club have presented their creative project at their community in front of the community people (leaders, parents and brothers/sisters).

Monthly Support sessions for Girls' club Mentors:

Support sessions for girls' club mentors are organized to conduct girls' club sessions with adolescent girls every month. The support sessions covered different topics every month which every topic is part of the main topics "Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR), Gender Based Violence (GBV), Early Child Marriage, Creative Project Rollout, GBV and introduction of Gender Focal Points (GFPs) etc." After getting the support sessions the mentors conduct sessions with the adolescent girls at their respective girls' club.



Day Celebrations:

One of the project's noteworthy achievements in July-2022 to June-2023 is various day observation including International Youth Day, International Girls Day, International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, International Women's Day and MHM Day. The project

organized a number of events to commemorate these days, including a seminar and discussion meeting with various GO and NGO stakeholders, a cultural program by Girls Club members and female mentors, the planting of fruit trees at different Girls Clubs, and an essay competition at the District Level as part of 16 Days of Activism in which Upazila Nirbahi Officer, Bandarban Sadar Upazila was present as chief guest of the event.



Creative project showcasing by Girls' club members and discussion meeting with community mothers, fathers/brothers:

In this July-2022 to June-2023 year, 60 creative project showcasing and discussion meetings done with mothers, 120 creative project showcasing and discussion meetings done with fathers/brothers girls' club members have presented their creative project works in-front of the community people (mothers, fathers/brothers and community leaders). The creative project includes projects like art, wall-magazine, drama, and dance. And 1 project each girls club has chosen and performed by combined age groups from one girls club.

After seeing the showcasing performed by the girls club members, the community were very impressed seeing their daughters doing great work and they can perform in front of the community people. Through the showcasing the community people also learnt about thematic issues MHM, SRHR and GBV through the messages done by the girls' club members.



Wash Lobby Meeting and MHM Toilet Survey July-2022 to June-2023:

In addition to these, targeted activities for July-2022 to June-2023 were also successfully completed during this reporting period. MHM-friendly toilet mapping has been completed in 15 schools across 5 unions in Bandarban Sadar. The results have since been shared with teachers and School Management Committee (SMC) members during a meeting.

Community awareness sessions with mothers and mothers-in-laws:

Discussions about menstrual health management, women's safety, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and gender-based violence issues were held in the community with the mothers and sisters-in-law of 30 girls' club members. It is suggested to local adolescent girls and women who are experiencing violence to dial 999 for assistance. Be vigilant at all times to avoid violence. Mothers and mothers-in-law determine which women or girls in the community will defy violence at the conclusion of the conversation. Also bring up gender-based violence with their family. Everyone in the village will be aware that there shouldn't be any violence.



Community awareness sessions fathers and brothers:

In July-2022 to June-2023 year, 60 community meetings were held with fathers and brothers to raise awareness about menstrual health management, women's safety, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR), and Gender-based Violence (GBV). One is advised to dial 999 for assistance if they are a victim of neighborhood violence. The meeting's attendees came to the conclusion that the community would oppose violence anytime it was used against it.



Meeting with Community, Traditional and Religious Leaders:

In July-2022 to June-2023, 3 meeting with Community, Traditional and Religious leaders is held at AKS Conference room where para headman, karbari and members from different community were present as participants. In the meeting discussed about OLHF project activities and objective, and then also discussed about Sexual Reproductive Health Rights (SRHR) and Gender Based Violence (GBV), and in early of 2023, 2 meeting held with Community, Traditional and Religious leaders where girls club members present their creative project works at the event and commitment given by the Community, Traditional and Religious leaders.

The participants said that, through this project activity girls are becoming aware about menstrual health, SRHR and GBV and they suggested that distribution of low-cost sanitary pads at the school level would benefits the girl students. And they were amazed and happy to see the girls' club members showcasing of creative project works and gave commitment to support the project activities success.



Multi-stakeholder meeting with different level GO & NGO:

The project improved its engagement and coordination with governmental bodies and project stakeholders throughout 2022. The project maintained close communication with

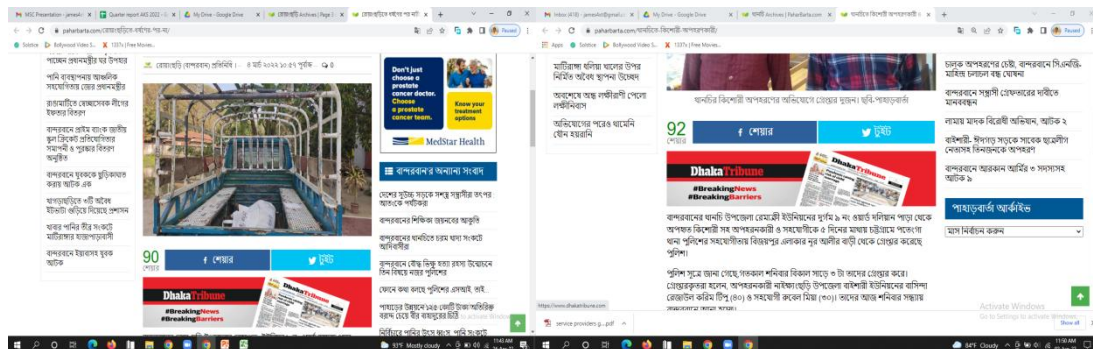
government officials and project stakeholders (such as the NARI network, the chairman of the HDC, the chairman of the regional council, the heads of the district departments, and the traditional community leaders) by inviting them to various project events.

The project hosted a multi-stakeholder meeting with different level GO & NGO meeting on December 17, 2022, as a continuation of its strategic engagement. At a district multi stakeholder meeting, girls club members' experiences and accomplishments were presented.



Media Monitoring:

As part of the media monitoring activity, the responsible project personnel has gathered statistics on GBV cases (344 victims of GBV; 267 of them were women and 77 of whom were adolescents) in 2021 from the One Stop Crisis Center (OCC) of the Bandarban District Sadar Hospital as well as four newspaper and online media reports on SRHR and GBV-related topics in the Bandarban district. Additionally, the project continues to engage the media in order to increase project visibility and promote evidence-based reporting of SRHR and GBV issues in Bandarban. The project has been directly engaging the local media in the project by extending invitation to participate in major project events (e.g. day observation, trainings, and meetings).



Promotion Rights through Mobilization and empowerment (PRiME_CHT) Project

- To establish ethnic women rights in customary law, reduce gender base violence, stop child marriage, marriage registration and increase local organization participation women leaders.

Objectives of the Project:

- Chittagong Hill Tracts traditional institutions and their customary law regulations shall be gender sensitive.

Organize annual activities review and planning workshop of Women Activist Forum

AnanyaKallyanSangathon (AKS) formed a district Women Activist Forum was formed with the aim of reforming customary law in tribal society, promoting marriage registration, prevention of violence against women, ending child marriage, increasing the leadership of women in traditional and local institutions. This activist forum has been formed with a total of 25 women including women heads of traditional organizations, women leaders of local organizations, young women leaders, school women teachers and women development workers.

Activist Forum members hold an annual meeting at the beginning of the year. In this annual workshop, the members of the forum formulate an annual action plan by discussing in detail what activities will be conducted throughout the year, what strategy will be implemented, who will take what responsibility.

Organize Quarterly activities review and planning meeting of Women Activist Forum

Quarterly meetings are held as per the annual work plan. In this meeting like the annual meeting, the strategy, distribution of responsibilities, when what work will be done are discussed. A total of 3 quarterly meetings were held.



Organize sharing meetings to establish social cohesion of Women Activist Forum Members

Activist Forum members have worked for a total of 10 women victims of violence in the last 1 year to get counseling, proper treatment and legal assistance.

A workshop was organized with community members at the community level to prevent violence against women. In the workshop, it was decided to take all initiatives regarding the introduction of marriage registration.

Conducting training for women activist forum members

AKS provided training in Transformational Leadership Development for capacity building of 25 Activist Forum members in total. The training helped them understand about their rights, build up leadership among.

Conducting training for Karbaries and Headmen

AKS has provided training on skill development with the aim of smoothly dealing with the challenges of elimination of discrimination while carrying out the duties and activities of 30 Karbaries and Headmen in total. The training helped them understand about their role and responsibilities.



Organize of Advocacy Workshop

AKS organized aadvocacymeeting withcommunity people at Udalbuniapara. In the workshop, it was decided to conduct awareness activities at the community level with the aim of preventing violence against women, stopping child marriage, promoting marriage registration, increasing the leadership of women in the traditional governance system.



Organize day observation and campaign

International Women's Day was celebrated on 8 March, 2022 and organized workshop as an awareness program at the community level to prevent violence against women, stop child marriage, popularize marriage registration, and increase the leadership of women in traditional governance systems and workshop was organized.

Achievements:

- Woman Activist Forum members skill in leadership, campaign and advocacy have Increased.
- There are 8 women candidates for Karbari posts in traditional governance system.
- Legal assistance provided to 10 women victims of violence.
- Headmen and Karbaris are committed to the practice of marriage registration.
- Headman and Karbari Institute have started to established women Karbari and Women Head.

Conclusion:

AKS has been implementing different activities for development of socio-economic condition in Bandarban Hill district since 1998. AKS has been trying her best to address the priorities as much as possible through implementing various projects. AKS is always active to contribute in the areas of poverty reduction, woman rights and ecological conservation.

AKS since its inception has been contributing in the areas of establishing woman rights, environmental sustainability, reducing sexual harassment, gender equity and improvement of living condition of Chittagong Hill Tracts peoples.

AKS and its staff members would like to express deep gratitude and sincere thanks to the donors, general body, Executive board, friends, Government body and well-wishers who helped us to make the last reporting year of AKS a meaningful, successful, contributed achieving and reflecting our mission to thousands of neighbors, especially the poor and marginalized people.
